



The Verb "Go" In Sinhala

Lazy But Smart Summary

Present & Future Tense:

In spoken Sinhala, the Simple Present, Present Continuous, and Future Tense are **IDENTICAL**.

SIMPLE PRESENT	<i>go / goes</i>		<i>don't/doesn't go</i>	
PRESENT CONTINUOUS	<i>going</i>	<i>ya·nā·va</i>	<i>not going</i>	<i>yan·né nāē</i>
FUTURE	<i>going^(FUT)</i>		<i>not going^(FUT)</i>	

Past Tense:

SIMPLE PAST	<i>went</i>	<i>gi·yaa</i>	<i>didn't go</i>	<i>gi·yé nāē</i>
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General:

- The verb form in spoken Sinhala **DOESN'T CHANGE** based on who is doing the action! See example below:
 - "He goes" = *é·yaa ya·nā·va*
 - "They go" = *é·yaa·la ya·nā·va*

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
